There's a new employment law firm in town.

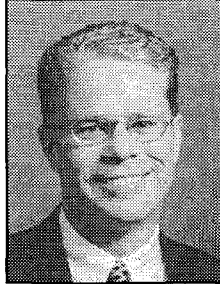
Lonny H. Dolin, J. Nelson Thomas and Patrick J. Solomon have teamed up to form Dolin, Thomas & Solomon.

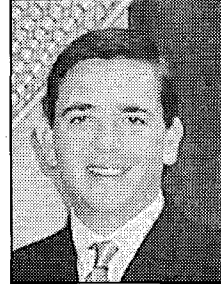
Dolin is a former partner at Harris Beach and has owned her own firm, Lonny
